PELIGRO MINIMO ACERCAMIENTO - AVISO

Blue Alert - Minimum danger - Approach/Withdrawal: Warning

Tropical disturbance more than 72 hours away.

Cyclonic disturbance warnings will be broadcasted at least every 24 hours, through the corresponding weather reports.

ACTION :

KEEP INFORMED

ALERTA VERDE

PELIGRO BAJO ACERCAMIENTO - PREVENCIÓN

Green Alert - Low danger – Approach: Prevention / Withdrawal: Monitoring

Disturbance: 72 to 24 hours.

Cyclonic disturbance warnings will be broadcasted at least every 12 hours, through the corresponding weather reports; this information will be provided by the State Civil Defence Office.

ACTION :

KEEP INFORMED

GET FAMILIAR WITH WHAT TO DO IN CASE OF A HURRICANE – ASK HOTEL’S RECEPTION DESK FOR INFORMATION

ALERTA AMARILLA

PELIGRO MODERADO ACERCAMIENTO - PREPARACION

Yellow Alert - Moderate danger – Approach: Preparation / Withdrawal: Follow-up

Disturbance: 60-12 hours.

Cyclonic disturbance warnings will be broadcasted at least every 6 hours, through the corresponding weather reports; this information will be provided by the State Civil Defence Office.

ACTION :

**LISTEN CAREFULLY TO ALL OFFICIAL NEWS
KNOW THE LOCATION OF YOUR SHELTER AND
PHONE NUMBER OF THE NEAREST CONSULATE
PREPARE YOURSELF FOR A POSSIBLE
EVACUATION – ASK HOTEL’S RECEPTION DESK
FOR DETAILED INFORMATION**

ALERTA NARANJA

PELIGRO ALTO ACERCAMIENTO - ALARMA

Orange Alert - High danger - Approach/Withdrawal: Alarm

Disturbance: 36-6 hours.

From this stage, the Specialized Operating Committees for Hurricanes will start working. Information regarding the disturbance will be provided at least every 3 hours. The population will receive this information from the State Civil Defence Office, through the mass media.

ACTION :

**EVACUATE RISK ZONES
FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS OF HOTEL STAFF
AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES
STOP ALL MARINE AND COASTAL ACTIVITIES
STAY INSIDE**

ALERTA ROJA

PELIGRO MAXIMO ACERCAMIENTO - AFECTACIÓN

Red Alert - Maximum danger - Approach/Withdrawal: Damage

Disturbance: 18 hours or less

Established when a tropical cyclone’s 34-knots (63 km/h) wind field strikes a damageable area or when it might damage such an area in less than 18 hours, depending on the cyclone’s intensity. Warnings will be issued at least every 3 hours. The population will receive this information from the State Civil Defence Office, through the mass media.
